Message from Cantor Socolof

Some Purim Torah

The Talmud tells us (Baba Meisa 36c) that we are required to attend the house of study. Should one go alone, or with someone else? Rav Kahuna says, Alone, as it says, And I alone escaped to tell you (Job 1). Rabbi Shmabbai says, With someone else, as it says, If you go with me then I will go, and if you will not go with me, I will not go. (Judges 4). Rav Kahuna said, This is not a fitting example, since it is quoting Barak in a conversation with Deborah the prophetess. There is a midrash that says that they were once betrothed, but he called off the marriage in the middle of the ceremony, when she had only begun to walk around him for the seven times. Thus it was always said of her that she had been around the Barak.

How often should one go to the house of study? Rabbi Obiwan says, The pious go three times a day. Rabbi BooBoo ben Yogi says, What of those who are not so pious? Can one be almost pious? Rabbi Obiwan says, Yes. Singers are almost pious, as they are *lamed-heyniks*. Rabbi ben Yogi said, How's that? Rabbi Obiwan said, La,la,la,la.

Rabbi Booyah asks: How shall we get there (to the house of study)? On foot. As it says, If you walk in My ways, and if you keep My charge, you, too, shall judge My house, and you, too, shall guard My courtyards, and I will give you free access among these who stand (Zechariah 3) Rabbi Gotz said, my teacher, Rabbi Aynzeh taught that we learn it elsewhere: Go walk around on the earth (Zechariah 6). Rabbi Sensen objected, One does not walk when one can ride. As it says, I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to me (Exodus 19). Rabbi Nudnik asked, Was that in coach or first class? Chacum answered, Even God couldn't afford 600,000 seats in first class. Aryehboom asked, No frequent flier miles? Rabbi Tzuneh said, If God is everywhere,

how would he even earn frequent flier miles? Rabbi Aryehboom responded, from the angels. Rabbi Tzuneh: They're non-transferable.

Rav Effes said, Not by air, but in a wagon, as it says in the Kaddish: b'agalah uv'zman kariv (in a wagon, and quickly). Rabbi Nuttin said, do not read b'agalah (in a wagon), but Ba'al gilah (master of Jello). Rav Anan said, Another county heard from. Do not read b'agalah (in a wagon), or, God forbid, Ba'al gilah (master of Jello), but bagelleh (a small bagel). This refers to the wheels on the wagon, which resembled small bagels. There is a midrash that tells of an alien who lands on Earth and breaks one of his landing wheels doing so. As he searches for a replacement, he passes a bagel shop, and sees that the bagels are the same size and shape as the wheels he needs. He goes in and asks to buy one of the wheels. "These aren't wheels," says the fellow behind the counter, "these are bagels." "What are they used for?" asks the alien. "They're to eat," says the fellow, and hands one to the alien. The alien takes a bite, chews and says, "You know, these would be great with lox and cream cheese."

Some say cream cheese, some say butter.

At this time of Purim, we are supposed to help those in need but who is to stop us from doing it year around? Did You Know About Purim



Purim, a holiday that recognizes Esther as our heroine, is a story of romance, loyalty, faith and courage. As in much of our history, we are assured that despite oppression and anti-Semitism the prevailing tyrant, in this case Haman, will ultimately be overthrown.

Purim is a holiday of feasting, costumes, masks, gaiety, noise from the groggers, hat shaped cookies – reminders of Haman's three cornered hat – filled with fruit and poppy seeds, gifts and goodies as directed in the Megillah.

Pious Jews fast on the day before Purim to honor Esther, who did not eat for three days before visiting the King, who she was seeing without being invited. Purim is the only time a Jew is allowed to get so "high" that he literally "does Not Know" the difference between cursed Haman and blessed Mordecai – this is known as Adeloyada – the gay quality of Purim.

So my friends, now that we have shared some facts about Purim, join us at Temple on Saturday March 11th at 6:00 P.M. for Havdallah and the Megillah Reading followed at 6:30 by a Purim Masquerade Party for **ADULTS ONLY**.

The cost is \$36.00 per person if purchased by March 3^{rd} and \$40.00 per person if purchased after March 3^{rd} . All tickets **MUST** be purchased by March 8^{th} .

FINANCIAL HELP FOR SUMMER FUN!

Camping activities, programs and travel with Jewish content can be monumental experiences for our children. With this in mind, the Gennis Incentive Program seeks all local children and young adults, ages 8 through 21, who will be attending a program with Jewish content.

A bequest from the estate of the late Sidney Gennis has set up an "incentive and scholarship fund" designed to help offset the cost of these programs. The estate, through a foundation Gennis created to honor his parents, Celia and Jacob, has given the Jewish Community Federation of the Mohawk Valley a trust to be used to encourage youngsters to seek out Jewish experiences.

To be eligible, you must be a Jewish child residing in the area and your parents must be members of the Jewish Community Federation of the Mohawk Valley (have made a donation to the UJA). To apply for this incentive/scholarship for this summer, you need to submit a letter explaining what program the award will be used for as well as some information about the applicant: name, age, parents, address and telephone. Please submit this letter to the Jewish Federation of the Mohawk Valley, 2310 Oneida St., Utica NY 13501 before April 30, 2017. Applications for fall programs need to be submitted by July 1.


