



Temple Beth El Cantor Message

Two and a half years ago I started teaching an adult education class at Temple Beth Joseph in Herkimer. There were a few people in the community who were interested in converting to Judaism. As I am not a rabbi, and cannot convene a Bet Din, I was not in a position to hold a conversion class, so it was simply a class for those interested in learning more about Judaism. We had a fairly even mix of Jews and non-Jews.

A bit over a year ago, thanks to the good offices of our USCJ Kehilla Relations Manager, we were put in touch with a rabbi who agreed to supervise the conversion process. I did the majority of the teaching, using his curriculum. Last month, we held the Bet Din and mikvah for four adults and three children.

It was a very happy occasion. I wish I could convey to you their excitement, joy and pride. This was the culmination of a long effort, and the attainment of something they had truly wanted and worked for. It was a blessing to be a part of.

Their excitement caused me to think of my own. Was I engaged in Judaism as they were, as a full commitment and a specific life choice? You might be inclined to say "Well, of course you are engaged. You're a cantor!" And so I am. But that speaks more to involvement than engagement, and these are separate things. Being involved speaks to participating and being busy with the tasks involved operating the synagogue in (services, school, b'nei mitzvahs, weddings, funerals, etc.). While engagement can have a few meanings, here I am talking in the sense of it meaning engrossed. It is the difference between those who may, from time to time, pick up an instrument to play, and those who cannot imagine going a day without playing.


I invite you to ask yourself the same question: how engaged with Judaism are you? Is it a tangential aspect of your life, something that you may notice from time to time? Or is it an essential part of who you are and what you do, infusing every day if not every action?

One of the goals of living a Jewish life is to live with *kavanah*, intent. Abraham Joshua Heschel, of blessed memory, said, "A moral deed unwittingly done may be relevant to the world because of the aid it renders unto others. Yet a deed without devotion, for all its effects on the lives of others, will leave the life of the doer unaffected. The true goal for man is *to be* what he *does.*"

What better time than the High Holidays, a time specifically reserved for introspection, to consider our own performance of the *mitzvoth*. Are we going through the motions, or are we treating each mitzvah with anticipation and joy, as an opportunity to more fully connect with the Almighty?

As we observe the Days of Awe, and pray that the coming year sees us all written for life, health, prosperity and peace, let us take some time to think about whether we act with *kavanah*, and how we might try to tap in to that excitement of those who are just being given the opportunity to live as Jews.






May this coming year 5781 be one of physical and spiritual healing.
