## Temple Beth El Cantor's Message

Not long ago a friend of mine shared an item on Facebook. It was a picture of a laminated card that is kept in the pews of the Westminster Presyterian Church in Charleston, South Carolina. With the permission of the kind folks at that church, I am presenting it here in a slightly modified form:

## TO THE PARENTS OF OUR YOUNG CHILDREN MAY WE SUGGEST...

Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. All are welcome!

Sit toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what's going on. They tire of seeing the backs of others' heads.

Quietly explain the parts of the Service and actions of the Cantor, gabayim, etc.

Sing and read with the rest of the congregation. Children learn how to behave in synagogue by copying you.
If you have to leave the service with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back.

Remember that the way we welcome children in Temple directly affects the way they respond to shul, to God and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship.

## TO THE MEMBERS OF OUR CONGREGATION

The presence of children is a gift to the Temple and a reminder that our congregation is growing.

Please welcome our children and give a smile of encouragement to their parents.

I am happy to note that the number of young children regularly attending our services has increased dramatically of late. As a rule,

these children are quite well-behaved, and only the youngest seem to give their parents cause to temporarily take them out of the room. They sing along with the prayers and are very enthusiastic about having access to kiss the Torah during our hakafot. The members of our congregation are tolerant and encouraging of their junior fellow congregants.

In other words, our congregation does not seem to need to be told that which is on the laminated cards. The children who attend are learning, from their parents, grandparents and the rest of the attendees, how to behave in the synagogue. More importantly, they are learning to make synagogue attendance a part of their regular routine.

Many years ago, I was in a different synagogue when a small child started talking. Not crying or complaining, just talking. The parents tried to shush the child. The rabbi said, "Do not stop the child when he is praying!"

If you have not done so recently, I encourage you to attend one of our Shabbat morning services and see for yourself the energy that a dozen or so young ones bring to a congregation. You may find it refreshing and rejuvenating. I have.

## Temple Beth EI Executive Director's Message

"Go to the women first"; Moses was told by God. Acquaint them with the principles of Judaism. The men will follow the women's acceptance of these principles and set the pattern of learning for her family.

Shavuot celebrates the birthday of our religion. Shavuot makes us keenly aware that it is in the home that the Ten Commandments are stressed. By the emphasis on honoring our parents, the observance of a day of rest and through the inculcation of the love of God, the woman sets the moral example throughout the home.

Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks is a serious and dignified holiday in late May or early June, it falls on the $6^{\text {th }}$ or $7^{\text {th }}$ of Sivan; May $20^{\text {th }}-21^{\text {st }}$ and has more than one name. Pentecost, the fiftieth day after the $2^{\text {nd }}$ day of Pesach, Hag Habikurim, Feast of the First Fruits and Zemen Matan Toratenu, Season of the Giving of the Torah, (The Ten Commandments).

We observe Shavuot in the Temple, Yizkor is observed the $2^{\text {nd }}$ day, it is customary to serve dairy to suggest the agricultural nature of the festival. Shavuot is a lovely holiday in a lovely season, even in the Mohawk Valley.

It is time to think about cleaning headstones and footstones at our cemeteries.

Last year we cut down trees, repaired some of the fencing (there is lots more to do), had stone work done at the front entrance, reset some stones that were tipping, and did extensive yard work beyond the usual mowing.

In the past 3 years we have cleaned more than 200 headstones and footstones and what a difference it made. Our cemeteries are beginning to look so beautiful and well cared for. We are so proud of the effort that many families made to beautify their cemetery plots. However there are many more stones that need our tender loving care.

The cost is very reasonable:

- Headstones \$50.00
- Footstones \$35.00

If you are planning to have your family plot cleaned send a note, send an email or give us a call and we will take care of the rest.

Perhaps you could even send a little extra and have a headstone or footstone cleaned for someone who has no family left to care for their plot.

## Future Planning Cemetery Plots

As many of you know we now own 5 cemeteries that we are responsible for. We do this to maintain the dignity and memories of our ancestors.

One of the results of this increase in responsibility is increased maintenance costs. In order to continue our policy of Perpetual Care we need to increase the cost of new graves and plots.

The new costs are as follows and apply to all Cemeteries owned by The Temple Beth El Cemetery Corporation.

## Effective August 1, 2018

One Grave Plot - $\$ 600.00$
Two Grave Plots - \$1100.00
Four Grave Plots - $\$ 2000.00$
Eight Grave Plots - \$3800.00
In order to purchase a plot or grave in The Temple Beth El Cemetery, the purchaser must be a member in good standing of Temple Beth El.

If you are purchasing a new grave the deed will be issued after the full payment is made.


## Schwartz Kallah / Waldman Lecture

Our Schwartz Kallah / Waldman Weekend is around the corner, on June 1st, 2nd, and 3rd! There is so much history to share, and we hope as many people as possible will come to share their parts in it. After the opening refreshments, we're starting things off with brief remarks by a few long-time community members; we're only too aware of how many such venerable congregants could have been featured in that role and would gladly have taken up the assignment. As detailed at the bottom of the page, the Social Hall will be an exhibition space all weekend long; we hope as many people as possible will bring pictures speaking to the history of the community and will add significant events to the timeline. We hope, too, that throughout the weekend the Social Hall will also be a space for storytelling, pontificating, conversation, and re/connection. The weekend builds to a final session explicitly dedicated to the sharing of memories from both communities over the many decades of Utica Jewish history (we only have a video from Emanu-El so far, but would be thrilled to have complementary material on Beth El if anyone can provide it). If all goes according to plan, the remarks, the presentations, the activities, the photos, the news stories, and most importantly the people gathered will spark all manner of memories, thoughts, and new ambitions. We hope those will be shared most volubly, all weekend long and especially in the closing session.

4:30 Screening of a short video about Emanu-El's founders, followed by reminiscences, dialogue, and noshing

We'll also have on display a variety of visual materials, including highlights from decades of JCC newsletters; selections from Rabbi Solomon Joshua Kohn's The Jewish Community of Utica, New York, 1847-1948; video greetings from Uticans afield; and photographs documenting and celebrating the history of the community. We hope everyone who can will bring along at least one photo (to be returned at the end of the weekend) for a collective montage commemorating the community's development, and we hope that all those with long family histories in town will be able to add salient events to the communal timeline.
