Temple Beth El Cantor's Message

On April 9th, Israel held national elections. Benjamin Netanyahu's Likud party edged Benny Gantz's Blue and White party to take 36 seats in the Knesset against Gantz's 35. The results reflect the fact that, like so many recent elections in democratic countries, the electorate is split. While many have talked and written about what these results portend for Israel, I would like to take this space to discuss the answer to an age-old question: Is it good for the Jews?

The answer is yes for some. Specifically, if you are an ultra-orthodox Jew this is very good news. For those of us who are not, and this represents the great majority of Jews in North America, the news isn't so good.

First, the good news. Netanyahu is a staunch defender of Israel and its borders. He is unlikely to accept any proposal that would in any way threaten Israel's security or existence. Those who attempt any action against Israel should expect to face swift and resolute retribution.

Now the bad news: like any politician, Netanyahu has made deals. In his case, he has thrown in with the ultra-Orthodox religious parties. As a result, they are likely to exert even more influence over questions of Jewish identity in Israel. Will this affect us here in America? Probably not directly, unless we or one of our children decide to move to Israel and then get married. Matters of family law in Israel (marriage, divorce) as well as the questions of who qualifies as a Jew under the Law of Return are under the jurisdiction of the rabbinate, and in Israel, that means Orthodox rabbinate.

To be sure, these matters have been hot topics of late. A Jew who chooses to make Aliyah is automatically accepted as a citizen of Israel. Since there is no civil marriage in Israel, you must be Jewish to be married by a Rabbi. But how do you prove that you are

Jewish? You must prove (with documentation, of course) that your mother and her mother are/were Jewish or produce witnesses amenable to the rabbinate to testify to this. How many of us could meet this standard, especially when non-Orthodox documentation is discounted?

Additionally, the outlook for groups such as Women of the Wall seems grim. Those who currently control the holy sites are not renowned for their inclusivity and they now have little incentive to go in that direction. Yes, the election was very close. One might conjecture that Likud and its partners would adopt a policy of unification. While possible, it would be counter to most recent history. It is reasonable to expect that the religious parties will take every opportunity to press their advantage with the government.

In short, some of us who have always thought of Israel as our other home may find that the door may not be quite as open as we had hoped. It is with no joy that I write this, and I pray that I may be wrong, but it seems that Israel will continue to be a difficult place to live fully as a practicing non-Orthodox Jew.

Meet the Speaker Helen Levinson

A child and teen during the Holocaust, Helen Levinson will be the speaker this year.

Helen was 10 years old when the Nazis invaded Poland. At 14, Helen was picked up by the Nazis on her way to school and sent to the concentration camp Majdanek. She spent several months of harrowing treatment. With help from someone who knew her, she was able to escape. Helen was reunited with her family for only a short time. As the horror and terror continually descended, her family decided to separate to ensure each member's safety. With an important, well thought out gift from her father, the early kindness of a few people and a keen sense of survival, Helen spent the remaining years of the war alone.

After the war, Helen was brought to the US through the sponsorship of a family friend. She lived in Rochester, NY with his sister, finished school there and graduated from the Eastman School of Music. Mrs. Levinson married, had a family and continues to live in Rochester.
