Temple Beth El Cantor Message

Many years ago, the 7th grade of our Hebrew School held a Friday Night service, as was the custom at the time. The youngsters sat to the side of the bimah as the rabbi and I conducted the service. During the d'var Torah, the students were not appropriately quiet, despite a few rounds of shushing. So I left the bimah and sat among them, which quelled the talk.

In class the following Monday, I directed them to write an essay on why it was important to act respectfully in services. One of the young scholars chose, instead, to write about why it was <u>not</u> important to do so. He suggested that it would be important if he had an established relationship with those at the synagogue, but not otherwise. I had him read Martin Buber.

I was reminded of this when another child of Temple Beth EI wrote on social media of how their four-year-old child, during a Zoomed Yom Kippur service, asked, "Why do I have to be quiet? The rabbi can't hear me."

To those of us who have spent years attending services at the synagogue, it is natural for our behavior during this new mode of praying to mirror our behavior at the House of Worship, be that the Temple or the JCC. But what do we say to a child who does not have that experience? A child who, although young, clearly understands the concept of muting the audio feed? The response I posted was, "The rabbi, no. God?"

As a prayer leader, I am sensitive to the fact that people are listening to me as I chant the prayers. I try to be careful to pronounce each word clearly and correctly. I also understand that some focus on the melody. Either way, my part is to act as a catalyst for the other participants. The goal is to help direct their thoughts so that their prayer experience is meaningful. In other words, to better let them listen to themselves.

As I have considered it, a better answer to the child might have been, "No, the rabbi can't hear you, but when you are speaking, you aren't listening, especially to yourself." This may be a bit deep for a four-year-old, I know, but I think it really addresses what we are trying to achieve during a service, whether we are all in the same room or not. I cannot help but wish I had the experience and wit to offer it to that student long ago. There may have been things there worth listening to.
