Message from Cantor Socolof

Some concepts are fairly concrete and universal. Everyone knows what you mean and agrees on what that is. Sunrise, for example, is something that is easily understood. Other concepts are more difficult to state definitively; the wide range of human experience provides variations and nuances that stymie efforts to make them truly universal.

Freedom is an example of the latter. While it may be a common ideal, its specific nature and texture differ across time and geography. As American Jews (some of us are actually Jewish Americans, but that is a topic for a different month), we are in a unique position to appreciate two different conceptions of and approaches to freedom.

As Americans, we tend to think of freedom as it relates to the individual. We rightly celebrate the Bill of Rights which overwhelmingly concerns itself with the rights of individual citizens in our republic. subscribe to the myth of the rugged individual who succeeds on the basis of their own intelligence and grit. Our freedom as Americans is clearly predicated on our opportunities to articulate our personal preferences.

Judaism takes a markedly different approach to freedom. For us, freedom is not about the individual so much as it is about us as a people. When we tell the story of Passover, we do not focus on how God liberated 600,000 or more individuals. We tell the story of how God freed the children of Israel. Our liberation, like the revelation at Sinai and so many other milestones in our history, was a national one; a communal one.

In Judaism we enumerate commandments, not rights. We are cognizant of our responsibilities as part of a liberated people. Being free means honoring our obligations to God and to other people. It means

understanding that there is a distinction between liberty and anarchy. It means voluntarily accepting the structure that Judaism provides for our lives.

As beneficiaries of these two traditions of freedom, we have the opportunity to integrate both of them into our lives. We are, in so many instances, advocates for the rights of individuals, to proper representation, to adequate health care, to proper schooling, to respect and pride. We have the appreciation of personal liberty we have gained from our experience as Americans, and the understanding of the need to help vouchsafe it to others that grows from our Jewish heritage.

As we celebrate Passover this year, let us remember what the rabbis said regarding this holiday: "Each person should regard herself as having personally been redeemed from Egypt." If each of us had been a slave, how much more important would it be to us that others not bear that burden? How much keener would be our understanding and appreciation of our freedom be? Enough, perhaps, to understand that when eaten in freedom, even bitter herbs seem sweet.

Camping activities, programs and travel with Jewish content can be monumental experiences for our children. With this in mind, the Gennis Incentive Program seeks all local children and young adults, ages 8 through 21, who will be attending a program with Jewish content.

A bequest from the estate of the late Sidney Gennis has set up an "incentive and scholarship fund" designed to help offset the cost of these programs. The estate, through a foundation Gennis created to honor his parents, Celia and Jacob, has given the Jewish Community Federation of the Mohawk Valley a trust to be used to encourage youngsters to seek out Jewish experiences.

To be eligible, you must be a Jewish child residing in the area and your parents must be members of the Jewish Community Federation of the Mohawk Valley (have made a donation to the UJA). To apply for this incentive/scholarship for this summer, you need to submit a letter explaining what program the award will be used for as well as some information about the applicant: name, age, parents, address and telephone. We invite you to listen to Peter Somogyi who was a young teen during the Holocaust. In 1944 Peter's mother and her children were deported to Auschwitz, arriving after being packed in cattle cars for four days. She kept Peter and his twin brother Thomas with her until finally, hoping to save their

lives, she gave them to Dr. Mengele for use in his research. It was the last time the 11 year old boys saw their mother or their sister.

Peter, his brother, and other male twins lived in one of the barracks. Just outside was a crematorium where bodies, stacked like logs, waited to be burned. Somogyi believes that because Mengele needed the twins for his experiments, he allowed them to live. But even so, there were no guarantees, only brutal experiments.




