Message from Cantor Socolof

We will be celebrating Shavout on Sunday, June 12th and Monday, June 13th. It is the light at the end of the omer tunnel. It is the festival when we commemorate the bestowing of the Torah upon the people of Israel.

God's giving of the Torah was a critical event in the history of our people. The Torah has been the foundation of Judaism for three millennia. Yet often overlooked in the celebration of this signal event is the fact that while God gave the Torah, we received it.

There are many *midrashim* about the extent to which the children of Israel were willing to accept the Torah on God's terms. They range from the people shouting "We will do, and we will listen!" as an expression of their willingness to receive it, even before knowing the specifics of what was in it, to the *midrash* stating that the Israelites accepted the Torah only because God threatened to drop a mountain on them if they didn't (suggesting a somewhat lower level of enthusiasm).

Tradition holds that <u>all</u> of Israel was there at Sinai to receive the Torah. As it says, "But not just with you alone am I making this covenant and this oath, but those of you standing here today before God, and with those who are not here with us this day." (Deuteronomy 29:13-14) One needn't be a student of law to question how someone who is not present to give consent can be a party to a covenant, a binding agreement that is all but impossible to dissolve.

One of the above referenced *midrashim* says that when God offered the Torah to Israel, God asked for collateral as security for our stewardship of this precious gift. It was only when the women offered their children as a surety for keeping the Torah that God was satisfied.

That being said, it is still on each of us individually, in every generation, to receive the Torah for ourselves. It is for us to make the Torah, not just an ancient scroll, but a living and vibrant document, a companion and a life coach, a foundation and a structure. This priceless gift is offered to us, and we have the option of embracing it, or simply leaving it on the table.

I ask you to embrace it. As we celebrate Shavuot, let each of us resolve to receive the Torah for ourselves. Let us stand in awe of this revelation, and let it change us and our world view, as it did for our ancestors so many years ago.

We will have a Joint Shavuot celebration on the 12th. Please check the details in this issue and be sure to make your reservation for a delicious kosher dairy luncheon.






